

Making Space for 1–30 Elementary Children

Make 1–5 Friendship Circles. Everyone rotates together and Site Leaders lead their activity once.

If you like, keep everyone together in the same space, but follow the schedule without repeating tasks or rotating.

Recruit as many leaders as you like, one per task, or fewer if people lead more than one area. For example, one leader might tell the story and also lead Bible challenge activities. With five minutes to rotate between sites or shift tasks, your schedule looks like this.
